# SPEAK UP

- Sometimes all it takes to help is someone speaking up when something does not seem right.
- Suspicious activity can come in many different forms. Trust your intuition and call it in. It may make all the difference.
- It is okay if deputies respond to your suspicious activity call and find that nothing is wrong. It is worth the effort; you may end up preventing a crime or help someone in need.

## BE A GOOD WITNESS

Try to write down a description of the person. If a vehicle is involved, describe the make, model, license plate number, and any damage or notable markings that can help with identification. All of this information is an important piece of the puzzle.
